Internships available at the University of Haifa International School

The International School offers students the opportunity to integrate career-related internships together with their studies during their time on campus. Special efforts are made for students who request specific internships relating to their career paths and study majors, and each placement takes into consideration the specific professional and academic interests of the student.

The internship program is coordinated by a member of the International School faculty, in coordination with on-site supervisors. Only students who are enrolled as full-time students in the International School are eligible for the Internship Program.

The growing interest in internships has led to a considerable expansion in the offerings, and we encourage students to inquire about opportunities that may not be listed. We welcome students interested in a specific field or location to be in touch with our Internship Coordinator about those possibilities and we will do our best to find the most suitable option for everyone. Often, we are able to find exclusive placements that are not usually available, based on the specific skills and interests of the student.

The internship opportunities have been expanded to social services, health services, education, marketing, communications, and business opportunities, as well as working with some of Israel's high tech companies!

Students who are interested in an internship must apply before the semester begins. In addition to their application for admission, they will need to complete a supplemental application for the internship program. Upon admission to the International School and receipt of the internship program application, the Internship Coordinator will be in touch with the student about possible internship locations.

When the student arrives to Haifa, she or he will meet with the supervisor at the internship location. Together they will establish the student's schedule. Students are expected to work 10-15 hours per week at their internship, earning 3-4

credits. Throughout the semester they may be provided with reading materials to support their work. In addition, students will need to submit weekly internship reports and mid-semester reflections on their progress to the Internship Coordinator in the International School. At the end of the semester, students will submit a 10-15 page research paper addressing an issue they dealt with at their internship.

Archeology

Department of Archaeology, University of Haifa – Interns will have the opportunity to work with faculty members in the Department on various projects and participate in archaeological digs. Must be an archaeology major or have taken a number of archaeology courses. No knowledge of Hebrew required.

ACRI is an NGO committed to promoting the universality of human rights and defending the human rights and civil liberties of all, regardless of religion, nationality, gender, ethnicity, political affiliation, sexual orientation, or socioeconomic background. ACRI is Israel's oldest and largest human rights organization and the only one dealing with the entire spectrum of rights and civil liberties issues in Israel. Arabic Language desired. Bnei Zion Genetic Counseling Clinic - The clinic deals with genetic counseling and research. The intern will be involved in research projects and direct work with the staff and with clients of the clinic. Courses in biology and genetics are required. Knowledge of spoken Hebrew is necessary.(H&M)

Biopsychology Laboratories, University of Haifa - The biopsychology laboratories are dedicated to research in brain/behavior interactions. Specific projects include research on brain mechanisms of social behavior and aggression, addictive processes and motivation, learning and memory and feeding. The intern will participate in the ongoing research projects – collecting and analysis of data, reading background literature, writing research reports and participating in staff meetings. Shadowing an Israeli Doctor - The internship involves working in a large urban hospital, shadowing a medical professional. The work involves direct care under the supervision of the medical staff. In addition there are possibilities of research in hospital administration. The internship is suitable for a pre-medical student with some clinical experience. Knowledge of Hebrew is helpful, but not essential. (H&M)

Ecological Studies Department, University of Haifa - Participation in field research in the areas of Aquatic Ecology, Community Ecology and Conservation Biology. The intern will function as a member of a research team in these areas. Basic courses in ecology and/or biology required. No knowledge of Hebrew necessary. (B, EN)

Wydra Institute for the Research of Maritime and Aviation Studies – The Wydra Institute conducts research in maritime studies and modern marine problems. The intern will integrate with the staff in their projects. Basic courses in International Commerce or Maritime Studies required. No knowledge of Hebrew necessary. Basic computer skills needed. (B)

University of Haifa Library - Working with the staff of the library in all areas. Majoring in library science and basic computer skills is necessary and a knowledge of spoken and written Hebrew is desirable, but not required. (LS)
