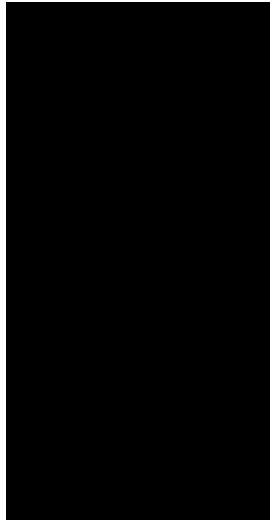


In a city with over 2,000 years of history, make some of your own! Maryland-in-Rome is based at the [American University of Rome](#) (AUR). Overlooking the historical center of the city, the American University of Rome is located on top of the Janiculum, Rome's highest hill, and just off the ancient Roman route Via Aurelia. The neighborhood offers a variety of restaurants, shops, cafes, and an outdoor market, allowing students to savor Roman living. Students will have the opportunity to engage with both the intricate history and the vibrant modernity of Rome, while staying on track to graduate. Students have the option to participate on a

number of excursions to other parts of Italy such as Pompeii or various cities in Tuscany.

All UMD sophomores, juniors, and seniors are eligible to apply to this program.

Maryland-in-Rome students enroll in regular courses at the American University of Rome (AUR), one of the oldest degree-granting American universities in Italy. Maryland students will be in classes taught by local and international faculty with AUR degree-seeking and study abroad students from around the world. AUR uses Rome as its classroom and Italy as an invaluable resource. There is an emphasis on active learning, a goal that the University's small student-to-faculty ratio helps to facilitate. It is a great place to take Art History, Business, Government & Politics, and of course Italian courses! All courses are taught in English, except for language classes.

Maryland-in-Rome is a hybrid credit program offering both resident and transfer credit courses. Review the [UMD equivalents for Maryland-in-Rome courses](#). For a full list of course offerings by term, visit the [AUR website](#).

AUR provides housing in furnished apartments located in the traditional, well-established neighborhoods of Monteverde, Giancolense, and Colli Portuense. While apartments are standardized in terms of basic amenities, they can vary greatly in terms of both proximity to the university, size, and aesthetics. There is generally only one (or a small number of) student apartment unit(s) per building and neighboring residents is typical Italian families who own their apartments. Most apartments have 2-3 bedrooms, lounge, kitchen and bathroom.

All apartments are either within walking distance or conveniently located to public transit routes relative to the university. Travel times to the university vary but generally range between 15 and 35 minutes. Variances in transit times largely depend on bus frequency and local traffic. Many apartments are directly accessible by one direct bus line, while others require a change. Detailed travel instructions to/from the university and an initial supply of public transportation tickets will be provided upon arrival.
